The Department Intent

Rationale

The overarching aim of the department is to give students the opportunities to develop creativity, ingenuity, innovation and problem-solving skills.

- In Art and Photography we aim to develop the creative and artistic ability of our students.
 Embracing the importance of art in a wider context through the study of the work of traditional and modern artists and designers, both with local connections and worldwide reach.
- In Design Technology subjects students are encouraged to identify needs and opportunities and access the necessary knowledge of skills and processes to respond by developing ideas and making products.
- In Cooking and Nutrition our aim is to instil in our students a love of cooking. They will access
 the skills and knowledge to cook a range of products and apply the principles of nutrition and
 healthy eating.
- We aim to ensure that there is a variety of courses at levels that meet the needs and aspirations of all of our students.

Department overview (staffing)

- The department employs 9 teaching staff members. In addition, we are supported by 3 part-time technicians.
- Many of our Art and Technology teaching staff where designers in industry prior to beginning their teaching careers. This brings with it a wealth of industrial knowledge and experience and supports our students in their creative career choices.

In addition, depending on your specialisation, you will develop your creative skills using digital media, specific ICT packages and computer aided design (CAD). You will develop knowledge in areas such as materials, manufacture and sustainability.

KS5

At KS5 progression to A Level is good, class sizes exceed 10 in each material area. Pupils follow the AQA Art and Design curriculum. We offer 3 A level choices:

- GCE Textiles
- GCE Fine Art
- GCE Photography

We have a number of students who will take 2 of the 3 subjects. Attainment is consistently above national expectations and a number of our students are successfully supported in their post 18 choices, securing places at University Art and design courses.
