SCIENCE AT THE CRIME SCENE

Join the 'Science at the Crime Scene' Saturday club to use a range of practical science skills to solve a murder! In the 12 weekly sessions from January to April 2019, you will use Biology, Chemistry and Physics based science skills to be a real life Crime Scene Investigator just like Barry Allen in The Flash!

This is what happened...

At 3am on Monday 17th December 2018 police were called to 10 John Moores Street, Liverpool after the neighbour reported a disturbance and saw a male suspect running from the property, down John Moores Street and turning right into James Parsons Way.
