The following issues were also raised from feedback on the information evening, and we are very happy to address these in order to continue our support of our pupils.

"I don't agree with the toilets being locked during lessons and parts of break and lunch"

Please be assured that toilets are always available to pupils. Any pupil who has an ongoing issue which may mean she would need more regular access to the facilities may be given a toilet pass from her Progress and Support Manager.

"I feel that children in the lower sets are not being given enough homework to reinforce their learning"

All pupils have a homework timetable that is set at the start of the academic year, a reminder to all staff about the importance of regular homework to all pupils will also be given as a result of this comment. If your daughter feels that she needs some support in consolidating class work at home but no work has been set, she can log into her free 'GCSEpod' account via the school website. This has lots of resources including short tutorials which she can watch on any computer, or download the free app onto any portable device.

"pupils who are disrupting the education of other girls...should be removed and dealt with"

Broughton Hall Catholic High School value the importance of good behaviour for learning. A whole school behaviour policy is in place which staff and pupils are aware of and follow. This includes the use of a review room for removal of pupils from lesson, as deemed appropriate by the class room teacher and director of subject. If you have particular concerns about a lesson your daughter is experiencing please contact the year team and further investigation will take place.
