

Broughton Hall Catholic High School

1. The name of the school is Broughton Hall Catholic High School.
2. The School was founded by and is part of the Catholic Church. The School is to be conducted as a Catholic School in accordance with Canon Law and the teachings of the Catholic Church, and in accordance with the Trust Deed of the Institute of Our Lady of Mercy and in particular:
 - (a) religious education is to be in accordance with the teachings, doctrines, discipline and general and particular norms of the Catholic Church;
 - (b) religious worship is to be in accordance with the rites, practices, discipline and liturgical norms of the Catholic Church;and at all times the school is to serve as a witness to the Catholic faith in Our Lord Jesus Christ.
3. The School is a voluntary aided school in the trusteeship of the Institute of Our Lady of Mercy and is an exempt charity for the advancement of the Roman Catholic religion and the advancement of education.
4. The name of the Governing Body is: The Governing Body of Broughton Hall Catholic High School.
5. The Governing Body shall consist of:
 - (a) 10 Foundation Governors;
 - (b) 2 Parent Governors;
 - (c) 1 Head Teacher;
 - (d) 1 Staff Governor;
 - (e) 1 Local Authority Governor;
 - (f) 3 Co-opted governors.
6. Total number of Governors: 18
7. Foundation Governors shall be appointed and may be removed by the Superior General of the Institute of Our Lady of Mercy or any other person exercising jurisdiction on her behalf.

Instrument of Government

8. The term of office for every Foundation Governor shall terminate on the fourth anniversary of the date of appointment. The term of office of all other Governors apart from the Head Teacher is 4 years.
9. This Instrument of Government comes into effect on 1st September 2015.
10. This Instrument of Government was approved by the Trustees of the Institute of Our Lady of Mercy on 21st April 2015 and made by order of Liverpool Local Authority on 28 April 2015.
11. A copy of this Instrument of Government must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and any Head Teacher if not a governor), the Sisters of Mercy, and the Archdiocese of Liverpool.
