


CLASS REPRESENTATIVES

AWARDS

At Broughton Hall good work, effort and attendance are all rewarded. Here is an explanation of the awards you might get in your first year here.

SERVICES TO TUTOR CERTIFICATES

When you are helpful to your Form Tutor, you may receive a certificate presented in our weekly assembly.

MERITS

If you work hard and do a good piece of work, you will get a positive point recorded on SIMS. When you have collected lots of merits across all subjects, you will be given a certificate.

DISTINCTIONS

A Distinction is for excellent work. If your teacher thinks that you did an excellent piece of work, you take it to show the Head teacher, who gives you a Headteacher's positive reward on SIMS.

COMMENDATIONS

If you are helpful at school, or take part in assemblies or show special care and consideration for others, you may be recognised as our Star of the Month.

OTHER AWARDS

A certificate is awarded termly and yearly for good attendance and punctuality. These are not difficult to obtain, all you have to do is attend school every day and be on time!

DETENTIONS

Detentions are given out to girls whose behaviour falls below standard. There are three types of detentions. These are:

- 10 minutes after school.
- Lunch-time detentions.
- After-school detentions 20, 30, 45 or 60 minutes.

Teachers may keep you after school for 10 minutes without notifying your parent. Subject teachers may issue longer detentions and will inform your parents via a text message, you too must tell your parent that you have a detention and the reason for it.


Zero-tolerance - you automatically get a detention at lunchtime for:

HOMEWORK

Homework may or may not be a new experience for you. In the first 2 weeks, to help you settle in there won't be too much homework.



HANDY HINTS FOR HOMEWORK.

- Note down the homework and deadline date in your Pupil Planner.
- Always do homework on the night it has been set, whilst classwork is fresh in your memory.
- Give homework in on time.
- Homework may also be set on MyMaths or on MOODLE you will get more details from your teachers. Record your log in details in your pupil planner.

FORM TIME

Your Progress Tutor will be your first point of contact in the school day.

You will register in your form room each morning.

Your tutor will help you get ready for your classes by making sure you have the correct:

Uniform

Equipment (pen, pencil, ruler, planner)

Books for the day

Your Progress Tutor will also lead you in an act of worship (i.e. a prayer or similar moment for thought and reflection) and give you notices for the day.

If you have any problems or questions, Form Time is the time to speak to your Progress Tutors to get help!

Once a week you will have a year assembly led by one of your Year Team or one of the Senior Leadership Team.

On assembly days you must make sure you are in early for school and have time to go to your locker so that you can be lined up by 8.35am ready to go in to assembly.

There will be other opportunities for you to do things with your form and your year group throughout the school year. Be sure to take part fully in form time and assemblies and always give your best.

FORM ROUTINE

Getting ready for learning

Go to your locker at 8.30am put your bag and coat away and get the books you need for the day, and then go straight to your form.

Make sure you have your full school uniform on, including your blazer.

Get your equipment out ready for your tutor to check.

At 8.45am your progress tutor will come in and you should stand behind your chair to greet them. They will say, "Good morning, 7........" You will reply "Good Morning."

It is important to be punctual and ready for your learning.

SCHOOL EQUIPMENT


'You should get all the equipment you need before you start school. Every evening you should pack your bags and look at your timetable and put all the books you need into your bag ready for the next day.'

- 7. Rubber
- 8. Pencil Sharpener

- 10. Small pair of scissors with blunt ends
- 11. Protractor
- 12.Compass
- 13. Calculator (Casio)
- 14. Pupil Planner
- 15. Pocket dictionary
- 16. Small padlock and 2 keys for your locker with a distinctive key fob.
- 17. Strong plain black bag/ Broughton Hall bag large enough to hold everything

Make up is not permitted


(This includes false tan, nail polish, false nails/eye-lashes and lip-gloss).



Breakfast is available between 8:00 - 8:30am.


The school meals are lovely! There is always a choice of what to have - a hot meal, a delicious fresh roll, a wrap and the desserts are the best.
