St Francis of Assisi Feast Day 4th October

Francis was born into a wealthy family but as a teenager, he discovered that not everyone came from rich families like him and that others could be treated badly.

Francis developed a great love for animals and for the natural world. He gave up his father's wealth and started giving what he had to the poor. Through prayer, God called Francis to a particular task, to repair the church. This didn't mean to fix the roof or the windows. God meant for him to bring the people of the church back in line with God's true purpose: To be a light in the darkness and be of service to all.

"You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. Lockdown

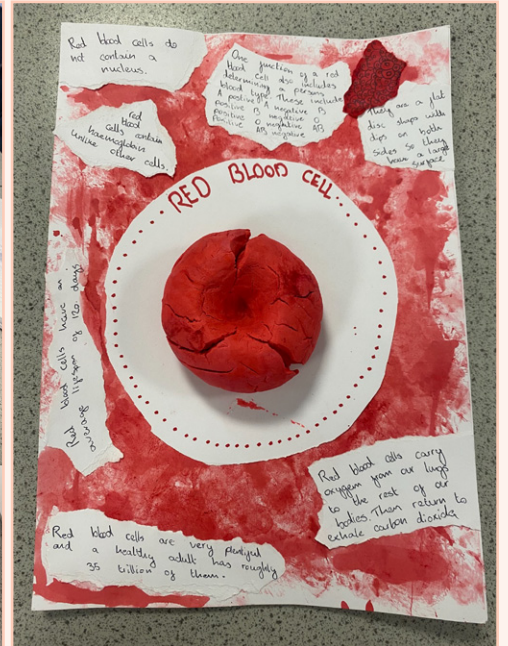
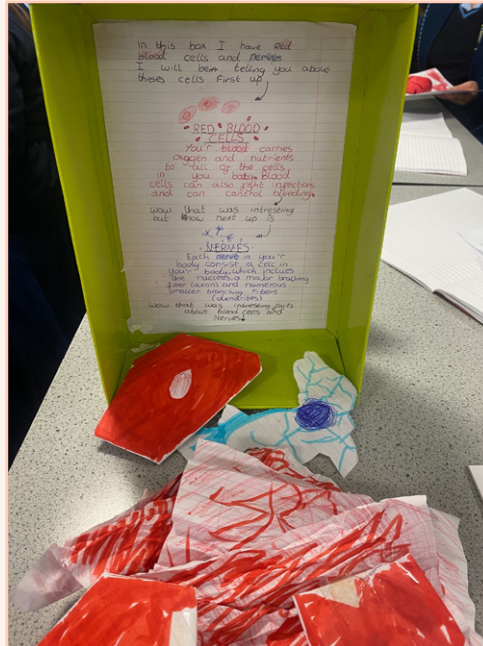
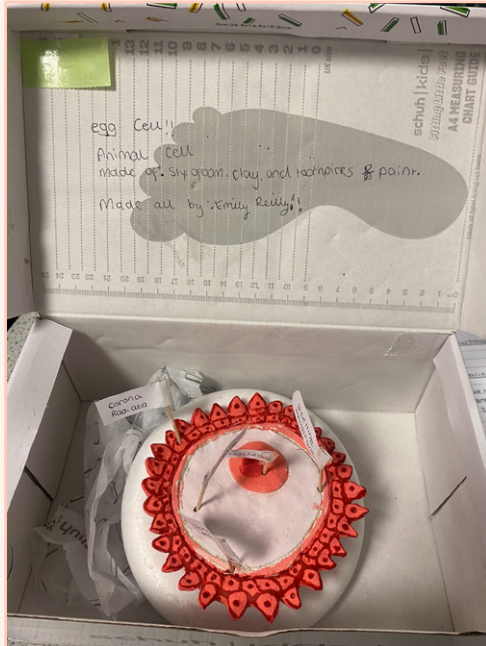
On Friday 4th October, during morning registration school practised its lockdown procedure.
