St Francis of Assisi Feast Day 4th October

Through prayer, God called Francis to a particular task, to repair the church. This didn't mean to fix the roof or the windows. God meant for him to bring the people of the church back in line with God's true purpose: To be a light in the darkness and be of service to all.

Jesus said

Year 7 Science


















HALLOWEEN ART CLUB
