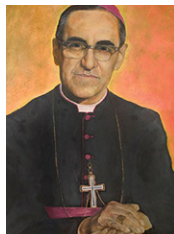
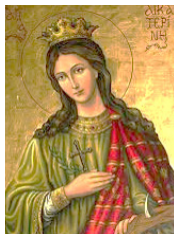

St. Oscar Romero – Resilience: To have the strength to carry on & the resilience to try again

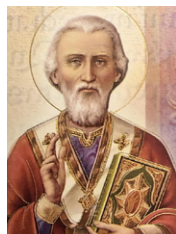
St. Nicholas – Generosity: To be generous to all in our 'One Community'

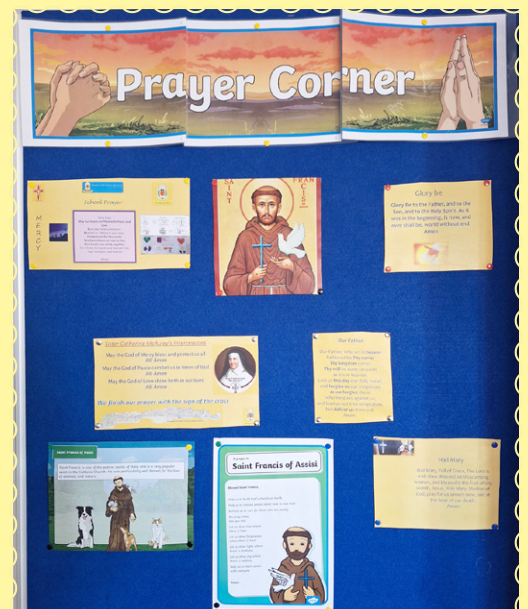
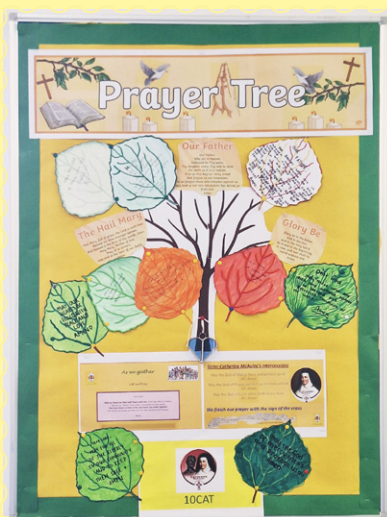
Bushcraft at Castle Howard

On Thursday 26th and Friday 27th September, 13 Year 8 pupils went to Bushcraft at Castle Howard, York. During this time, they learnt how to make and maintain a fire to keep warm and to cook food on. Students were staying in a remote part of the woods, and everything there was self-sufficient with solar panels even powering the air fryers to cook breakfast for us. The group was separated into two teams who built shelters and learned how to make it secure, safe and warm against the elements. Later on, during our first evening we had s'mores around the campfire and made survival bracelets.

Shannon and Joe, our group leaders, made us feel welcome and developed our enthusiasm for the outdoors. We played games such as 'Predator' and 'Where's My Monkey?', where we had to compete either on an individual level or as a team. Day 2 we played even more of our favourite games, ate fresh fruit, before it was time to learn first aid and how to stretcher someone away from danger and we had to practice this with students and staff!

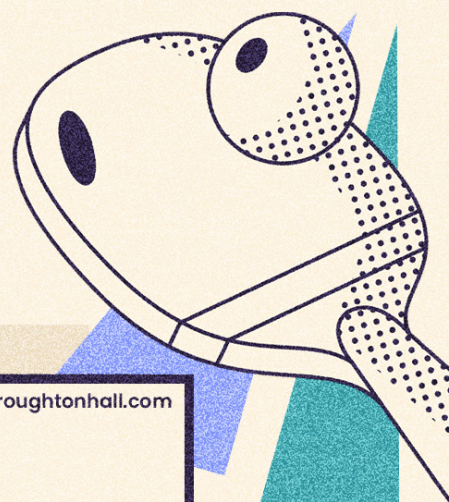

Should I keep my child off school?

Yes

Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics

but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
