

Working Together to Improve School Attendance: Changes made to attendance fines

Following the recent updates to government guidance on attendance, there have been changes to the ways in which Broughton Hall is required to manage term time holidays.

The fine for taking a child out of school during term time has risen from £60 to £80 per child.

If this fine is not paid in the first 21 days following the penalty notice, it will rise to £160.

All schools are now required to consider a fine when a child has missed 10 or more sessions (5 days) for unauthorised reasons, including a term time holiday. This will be doubled if it happens again within three years. Those with a third fine in a three-year period now face prosecution. There is no right to appeal a penalty notice.



Headteachers can only grant an authorised term time absence in exceptional circumstances, which are defined as one-off events that are unavoidable, such as health reasons, family bereavement, weddings, or funerals.

At the start of the month (Thursday 3rd October) Year 11 pupils headed off on their second and final expedition in order to complete this part of their Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award.

The Duke of Edinburgh Award (originally launched by the late Prince Philip in 1956) is a non-competitive program that helps young people develop skills, build confidence, and overcome challenges. It's open to young people aged 14–25 and has three levels: Bronze, Silver, and Gold. If the pupils complete all four sections (Skills, Physical, Volunteering and Expedition) they gain and additional qualification and develop skills valued by many employers. In a poll of more than 500 senior managers commissioned by The Duke of Edinburgh's Award, 93% revealed they are more likely to employ a candidate who can demonstrate achievements beyond their curriculum studies, such as a Duke of Edinburgh's Award, with 86% looking more favourably on a candidate who shares evidence of volunteering and other extracurricular activities.







We left school, following a prayer by Chaplin Phil, and made our way to the start point in Melling. The pupils faced the challenge of three days of walking and two nights of camping in West Lancashire. They completed a total of 50 kilometres, following parts of the Leeds to Liverpool Canal and the Trans Pennine Trail before finishing in the village of Parbold on Saturday afternoon. The pupils did very well throughout, especially when you consider they have to be self-sufficient throughout, cooking meals themselves, carrying everything they need each day in their expedition rucksack



Auschwitz visit

On Thursday 10th October, six history students from Year 12 and Year 13 attended a trip to Auschwitz-Birkenau with the Holocaust Education trust. The girls flew to Poland with Stasia the project coordinator from Manchester airport at 0630 and returned later that evening.

Prior to this visit, the students attended a seminar about the day and will reflect upon their experience and the lessons of the Holocaust. They will then design and carry out a plan to spread the lessons and take action. Since 1999, 41,000 students and teachers have taken part in this project and it is based on the idea of 'hearing is not like seeing'.

The students will be able to use this experience and knowledge to help support with their coursework which focuses on responsibility of the Holocaust. Upon their return back to Manchester, they were also treated to seeing the Northern Lights.



Year 12 University of Huddersfield visit

Year 12 students attended an open day at the University of Huddersfield. Students had an opportunity to visit talks and drop ins about several university courses. Students enjoyed viewing the fantastic facilities!









On Thursday 17th October, Year 7 pupils joined the English department in celebrating Harry Potter Day, a national day of celebration for the books of Harry Potter. To celebrate, pupils completed a description activity on mandrakes and then in English lesson they attended a virtual lesson with Luna Lovegood herself, from Hogwarts school of Witchcraft and Wizardry.

In the Virtual lesson, pupils explored several famous Harry Potter settings before planning out their own description of them. All pupils involved found the lesson really engaging and enjoyed having Luna from the books as their teacher for the day. All descriptions will be judged by the English department and the winner will receive a special prize.

Harry Potter Day was a huge success, and we will hopefully be able to carry on the magic with a trip to Harry Potter Studios, next year!



Year 13 Biology





Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over		
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode		
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19		
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics		
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared		
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started		
Scabies	they've had their first treatment		
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics		
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
