On Monday Il November our Morning prayer & Liturgy focussed on Remembrance. We discussed Service, Determination and Bravery at the D Day landings as it is the 80th anniversary of the operation and we followed the story of Marie Scott a World War II veteran who shines light on how many women served our country during the war. During Lesson two we considered, 'Who we would like to remember and made written dedications to those who have inspired us and those who served in the war from our own family histories.





We then held a service on our remembrance yard between the poppies and our wooden cross. Student representatives from each year group gathered with staff, and prayers we prayed for those who have lost their lives in service, those who have suffered through injury and trauma and for those who have lost loved ones in conflict and war. Mr. Preston (Head of School), and Mrs. Hayes (Deputy Head), laid wreaths as our students held lights of hope for the future. The Last Post was played across the school, and a two-minute silence was held. Each year remembrance becomes increasingly significant as our world can feel unsettled and unstable, but we have a great hope in Christ Jesus summed up by our scripture reading;

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. 1 Peter 1 Verses 3–5.


