185 years of Service

On Monday 25th November a Mass of Thanksgiving was held in Bermondsey London, giving thanks for The Sisters of Mercy's 185 years of service and celebrating The Feast of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Most Holy Trinity Church in Bermondsey, in the Archdiocese of Southwark hosted the joyous celebration and was full of visitors connected to Mercy Ministries.

In 1831, a new parish priest, Father Peter Butler, was sent to Dockhead parish in Bermondsey, South London. Although newly ordained, he was practical, capable and ready for the challenge of serving in one of the poorest parts of the city. At the time Bermondsey was an extraordinary place, warehouses and factories were filled with goods from all over the world, yet local and migrant workers lived in desperate poverty, hand to mouth in overcrowded, dirty housing.

In 1838 Bishop Thomas Griffiths wrote to Catherine McAuley, the foundress of a new religious order in Ireland,for help from the Sisters of Mercy. A Convent was built in Bermondsey and Catherine McAuley with a group of Irish sisters prepared the new convent for its future mission.

I think the entrance hymn All are Welcome, reads very much like a prayer and is a fitting tribute to God's work through the Sisters of Mercy. The words are very important to Broughton Hall Catholic High School, as they remind us of God's love and Mercy, both now and into the future.

All are Welcome.

Let us build a house where love can dwell and all can safely live, a place where saints and children tell how hearts learn to forgive. Built of hopes and dreams and visions, rock of faith and vault of grace; here the love of Christ shall end divisions: all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.

Let us build a house where prophets speak, and words are strong and true, where all God's children dare to seek to dream God's reign anew. Here the cross shall stand as witness and as symbol of God's grace; here as one we claim the faith of Jesus: all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.

Let us build a house where hands will reach beyond the wood and stone to heal and strengthen,

serve and teach, and live the Word they've known.

Here the outcast and the stranger bear the image of God's face;

let us bring an end to fear and danger :

all are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.

Let us build a house where all are named, their songs and visions heard and loved and treasured,

taught and claimed as words within the Word. Built of tears and cries and laughter, prayers of faith and songs of grace,

let this house proclaim from floor to rafter :

all are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place.









Central Library Visit
