#### Reminder about completing your Bronze or Silver Award.

Expeditions may now all be complete but for any participant, all four sections of their Award must be finished off to achieve their Bronze or Silver Award.



In the spring term pupils submitted a 'plan' for their extra- curricular chosen activities (physical, skills and volunteering sections) on their e-dofe account. They also set their own timescale; three or six months. The Award expects that they spend an hour a week completing their chosen activity.

Pupils will have had to organise a named assessor; an independent adult, who would eventually complete and sign their assessor report. For example, the coach from their sports team, a music tutor or a manager from a charity shop.

Once all these details had been checked, each plan will have been approved.

In order to show regular participation and attendance in their chosen activity, as well as the development of any skills, pupils can upload evidence, such as photographs, to each section.

Pupils should now log on to their e-dofe accounts in order to check the end dates for each of the skills, physical and volunteering sections.

When they have completed the 3 or 6 months of their chosen activity, they need to give their named assessor a blank copy of the assessor report from their Welcome Pack. The assessor should complete the report card and then the pupil needs to upload it to their e-dofe account, making sure the image is clear and can be read online.

This should be marked it as an assessor report when they upload it (simple box to click). They will need to check later that it has been approved. If not, they may need to fill in any missing details such as their participant number.

If they have misplaced copies they can see me for a replacement. Alternatively they should check their e-mails as they will have been sent copies of anything which was contained in the Welcome Pack.

When all four sections are complete and each has been approved, they will receive an automated e-mail confirming that they have completed that level of the Award. Certificates and badges will be given out next term to those successful pupils.

#### Thank you to all involved.

So many pupils taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award have worked incredibly hard outside of school to complete the other parts of the Award. Pupils have given up hours to complete voluntary litter picking or help staff events such as park run. Many have developed new skills or improved existing ones. I have seen incredible stamina, resilience and determination to overcome the challenges of the expedition section. Thank you to all pupils involved.

This academic year we have completed five expeditions since last September. This has involved a lot of staff time in the preparation of these off-site events. I want to thank all of those staff involved whether directly or indirectly with their time, help and support so that this part of the Duke of Edinburgh Award can take place. The expeditions have enabled our pupils to gain new experiences, make lasting memories and develop life-long skills whilst on their initial 'Bronze Journey' and also their Sliver Award.




# **SEND Intervention Spotlight**

# **Broughton Hall**Behaviour Policy

**Broughton Hall Catholic High School,** founded by the sisters of Mercy, empowers our Catholic family to flourish through Faith, Hope and Love.

In school, our students are taught how to flourish through the Mercy Values of Learning, Acceptance, Resilience, Community, Environment, Generosity, Sincerity, Service and Forgiveness.

#### **Mercy Values**

#### **Expectations - BE BROUGHTON**

BE ON TIME: attend all lessons, arrive on time
BE READY: bring equipment and wear correct uniform
BE RESPECTFUL: listen, use manners, keep class tidy
BE RESPONSIBLE: engage in learning, make good choices
BE SAFE: follow the rules and guidance of staff

#### **Equipment**

Students must bring: a pen, pencil, ruler, required books, PE kit (on PE lesson days), lunch card, lanyard, and a school bag.

#### **Appearance**

Uniform: blazer, gingham blouse, cotton jumper (optional), knife pleat skirt or trousers, navy socks / tights, black shoes. Jewellery: one pair of studded earrings and wrist watch. Hair: extreme or unnatural hair colours are not permitted. This will be checked daily with consequences in place if a breach of the rules is not resolved.

#### **Mobile Phones**

Mobile phones, ear pods and smart watches are not permitted in school. Locked phone pouches must be used for school. Visible phones will result in serious consequences.

#### Attendance / Punctuality

We define regular attendance as 97% or above. Students are expected to arrive by 8:30 am. Those who arrive later will be marked late and must attend a 30 minute detention that day. Students must attend all lessons. There are serious consequences for persistent truancy.



One Heart, One Mind

Students represent Broughton Hall both inside school, in our community and online. Throughout the school, students are expected to move calmly, walk on the left and follow the one way system. During break and lunch, students must stay in designated areas. Manners are to be displayed to our whole school community.



#### ★ Rewards ★

Students are rewarded with **Mercy Points** for displaying our Mercy Values. Points are issued on **Class Charts**. Students earn points to be recognised in celebration assemblies, earn prizes and school rewards.

- MI Demonstrating Mercy Values and excellent learning
- **M2** Exceeding expectations
- M3 Weekly recognition for effort, attendance, punctuality
- M4 Sustained effort for a half term
- M5 Sustained effort over a year

### **Sanctions**

**Poor behaviour in school is not tolerated.** Understanding that there will be consequences helps students make the right decision, promotes good behaviour and leads to better learning.

#### Consequences

- C1 Chance: misbehaviour observed; reminder given
- C2 Change: misbehaviour continues, final reminder
- **C3 Consequence:** repeated misbehaviour, removed to another class and receive a 30 minute, same-day detention
- **C4 Reflection Room:** misbehaviour doesn't stop, student taken to the reflection room until ready for reintegration. 30 minute, same-day detention
- C5 SLT: an incident or serious misbehaviour displayed will result in a serious consequence. This could include SLT detention, extended period in the reflection room, suspension, off site direction or permanent exclusion

The behaviour policy follows all required statutory guidance. School and parents have to work closely together in partnership so that all our students achieve at the highest possible level and leave school as well-rounded young adults as outlined in our **Home-School Agreement**.



# **Mobile Phone**

# Loss, Theft or Damage



School is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen phones



Phones in pouches should be stored in school bags



**Lost and damaged** pouches must be replaced by parents at a charge of £15

# **Usage by Students**



Mobile **Phones** are permitted on school premises.



Mobile Phones must be stored in a school-approved "Hush" locking pouch during school day.



Mobile Phones brought into school without a pouch must be handed in on arrival.



Air Pods are not permitted. Air Pods and Smart Watches will not work when phone is in the pouch.



**Exceptions for medical needs** are considered case by case.

### **Sanctions**

Students must adhere with searches and confiscations as per DfE guidance.

Breaching mobile phone rules is very serious. This will result in confiscation and students sent to the reflection room.

Parents will be required to collect confiscated mobile phones at the end of the school day between 3:15-4:00pm.

Any student who refuses faces a possible suspension.

Serious breaches, such as sexting, up-skirting, or threats, may involve police or other agencies.

Parents should email the school for a non-urgent issue in the first Communication instance. If there is an urgent issue, such as a family emergency or safeguarding concern, parents should call the school office.



All students require a school bag to carry their equipment / Hush pouch.

We accept a school branded or plain black tote or rucksack.

School branded bags can be purchased at school via Parent Pay.

Our new Year 7 students will be gifted with a black Broughton tote back when they start!

One pair of small gold or silver stud earrings can be worn. No other jewellery is permitted.

**School Shoes** 

Trainers are not permitted!

Shoes must be flat, plain black and polishable.
