Confirmation for Year 8 Students and also older students who may have missed the opportunity in recent years

The archdiocese of Liverpool is inviting young people in year 8 (and above) to receive the sacrament of confirmation. Confirmation is a sacrament through which we receive the Holy Spirit to make us stronger and more perfect Christians and true witnesses of Jesus Christ.

The preparation for the sacrament will begin in school with an introduction to the sacrament from Animate, the archdiocesan youth ministry team. Year 8 pupils will then study the subject of confirmation in their RE classes After the registration deadline has passed your child will be invited to preparation sessions in your local area (parish / deanery). Following these local preparation times young people will be invited to be confirmed.

If your child would like to receive the sacrament of confirmation this year it is essential they register online at:

https://liverpoolcalled.co.uk/

Registration must take place before the 15th March.

Please complete the form that can be accessed through clicking the button at the top right-hand side of the webpage ('Register for Confirmation'). If you are unable to do this at home please inform the school chaplain who will be able to help.

When a young person has registered, and after the deadline of the 15th March, they will be contacted by your local confirmation co-ordinator who will take you through the next steps of the preparation process. Parishes will run their preparation at different times and you should contact your parish priest if you feel your child has not been invited to preparation meetings.

Author visit Sophie Anderson

As part of our National Storytelling Week celebrations on Thursday 8th February, a group of year 7s had the amazing opportunity to meet real life Children's author, Sophie Anderson.

Sophie is a bestselling novelist who has won several prestigious awards for her books, including the Wales Book of the Year Award. Sophie's books have been translated into over twenty-five languages, and The House with Chicken Legs has been adapted for stage by Les Enfants Terribles.

The pupils were able to find out how Sophie became an author and what inspired her to write before having a go at crafting some of their own stories. One pupil said of the workshop, "It was amazing, Sophie was really inspiring and it was really fascinating to hear about her journey." Another said, "I loved the fact that Sophie believes there's a writer in all of us. It's made me want to write more"

Sophie said she had a lovely afternoon with the pupils involved and would love to come to Broughton again to encoruage more pupils with their writing.

At the end of the workshop, several pupils said they would love to carry on with their writing and have decided to join the Creative Writing club on Thursday after school.
