Liverpool's Schools' Parliament – Mental Health

As part of Broughton Hall Catholic High School's Mental Health Ambassador programme we attended one of Liverpool's Schools' Parliament events as representatives of the whole school community. Young people from across the city met at Liverpool Town Hall to discuss ways to manage mental health issues in schools. The Oxwell Student Survey found that almost 40% of year 7 – 13 students in Liverpool had a Mental Health problem affecting daily life. Broughton Hall Catholic High School students have had direct and authentic involvement in making the decisions on how school's can best respond to the current findings, help develop relationships and how to give students the tools to help others.



Liverpool Schools' Parliament was a fantastic opportunity for students to learn how to effectively communicate the opinions of themselves and others and have their voices heard in the form of a debate. Pupils were able to develop their leadership and organisation skills preparing their arguments and gathering the opinions of the wider school community on the topic of mental health. Pupils experienced politics in action, learnt more about democracy and had fun exploring the beautiful Town Hall with a guided tour of the Chambers.
