UKMT Intermediate Maths Challenge

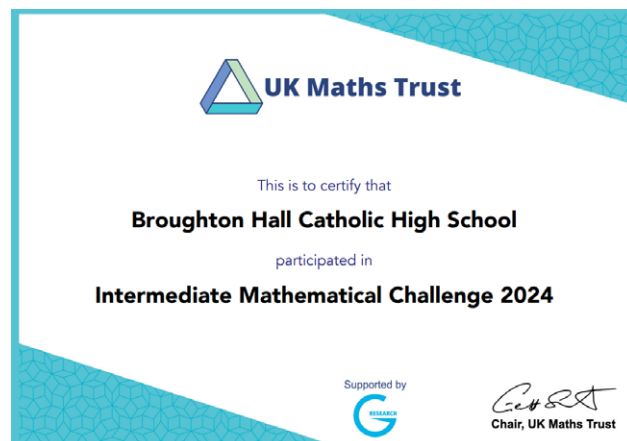
In January fifty seven girls took part in the UKMT intermediate maths challenge and we have the results back:
