## Broughton Hall Catholic High School

Thirty-three Year 9 pupils have now started their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award. Each pupils should have now have logged onto their online e-D of E account. Usernames and passwords have been individually e-mailed to them. All pupils can access their accounts by using the participant app. or by going online.

To ultimately achieve their Award, a participant must complete each of the four sections: Volunteering, Skills, Physical and the Expedition section. For the first three sections, pupils must organise and arrange their own activities and spend around an hour a week on each for the timescale they have set themselves.

Pupils have been sent reminders (via their school e-mail) and by now should have submitted their plans for approval and checking before they begin them. If they are struggling to organise something, they should contact Mr Halewood for some additional help and support. The D of E website is also a great source of ideas.

Many pupils fit an existing extra-curricular activity to suit their Skills or Physical sections. For example, if they already take part in a martial art such as Judo or Karate and are working towards their next grading, this would suit their Skills section.

In the north of England 648,102 hours of volunteering were completed by young people last year as they took part in their Duke of Edinburgh Award. Some of the current Year 9 pupils have already started their Volunteering sections. Volunteering activities have included helping at a local charity shop weekly, supporting the elderly in their community and returning to a former primary school to help with an after-school club.

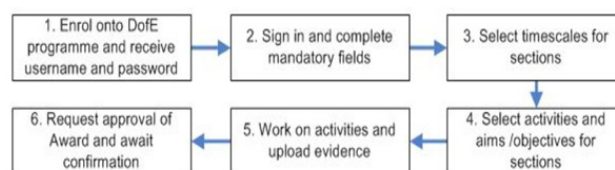
Dates for expedition training events will be sent out as soon as final arrangements have been confirmed by campsites and coach companies.
