Amelie W was awarded a Merit for achieving in the top 25% of students around the country. Big well done to all students who took part!



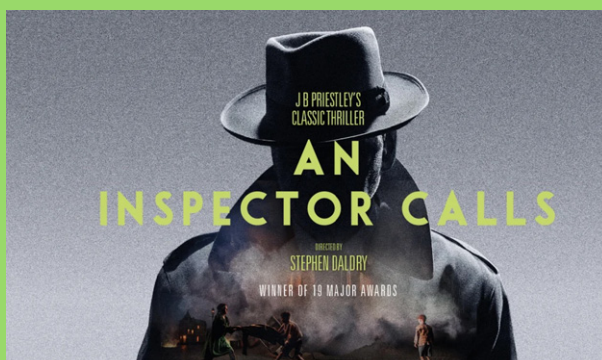

It was a brilliant opportunity for our girls who all really enjoyed the chance to see some world class netball up close.



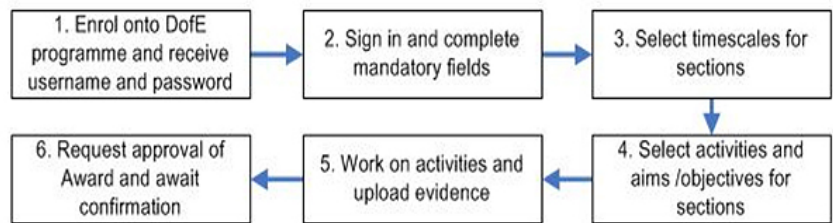

The thirty-five Year 9 pupils who have now started their Bronze Award and the seventeen pupils in Year 10 who have begun their Silver Award should now be well underway with their skills, physical and volunteering sections.

Their Award is comprised of four sections: Volunteering, Skills, Physical and the Expedition. All sections have to be completed to achieve their Award.



Pupils should have now received their Welcome Packs through the post. This contains a pack of assessor cards and more information for parents and carers as to how you can support your child through their Award.

These are posted to home addresses once a participant has logged on to their online e-dofe account and updated their contact details. They can take 2-3 weeks to arrive. Any pupil who has done this and hasn't received their pack should see Mr Halewood in D9 after school.

Showing progress for a section

Pupils are expected to add evidence to each section whilst they are completing it. They will have chosen their timescales (3 or 6 months for Bronze) and the minimum piece of evidence required, is a fully completed assessor's report. ***This is only completed and signed by their chosen assessor only once they have completed everything at the end of 3/6 months.***

'Evidence' is submitted online and can take the form of a photograph, for example, a screen-shot from their smart watch of their workout at the gym or a scanned image of a certificate of a qualification achieved, such as a grade 4 in piano. They can even add text and write a description of what they completed that week.



As participants are expected to be spending around an hour each week on their particular activity, I would recommend that they add regular evidence every few weeks to show progress and that they are regularly participating in their chosen activity.

Periodically, their assessors will be contacted by the School to ensure that they are attending and to check progress.

Any evidence submitted to their e-dofe account will be checked by the D of E Manager. If it is a suitable and relevant piece of evidence, the participant will see that it will have been approved (a green tick will appear next to it on screen). Alternatively, they may be sent a query online and may need to alter it.
