



In preparation for our GCSE exams, Year 11 geography students visited the lovely River Alyn. We visited three sites to investigate how rivers change as they travel downstream. Students got to see in the real-world, all the things they had learnt in class. We started the trip in the upper course and headed further downstream, measuring the width, depth, velocity, bed-load shape and bed-load size collecting primary data. Many of the students took the opportunity to go in the river, with a pair of wellies of course, to learn new geographical fieldwork skills to complete their own investigations.

This trip was great fun, and also crucial to our GCSEs as it will feature in the Geography paper three exam. This trip was an exciting new experience for us and allowed us to develop a greater understanding of rivers and their features, whilst also bringing to life our learning in the classroom. A number of students even said they enjoyed it so much they would like to come back again soon with family.
