



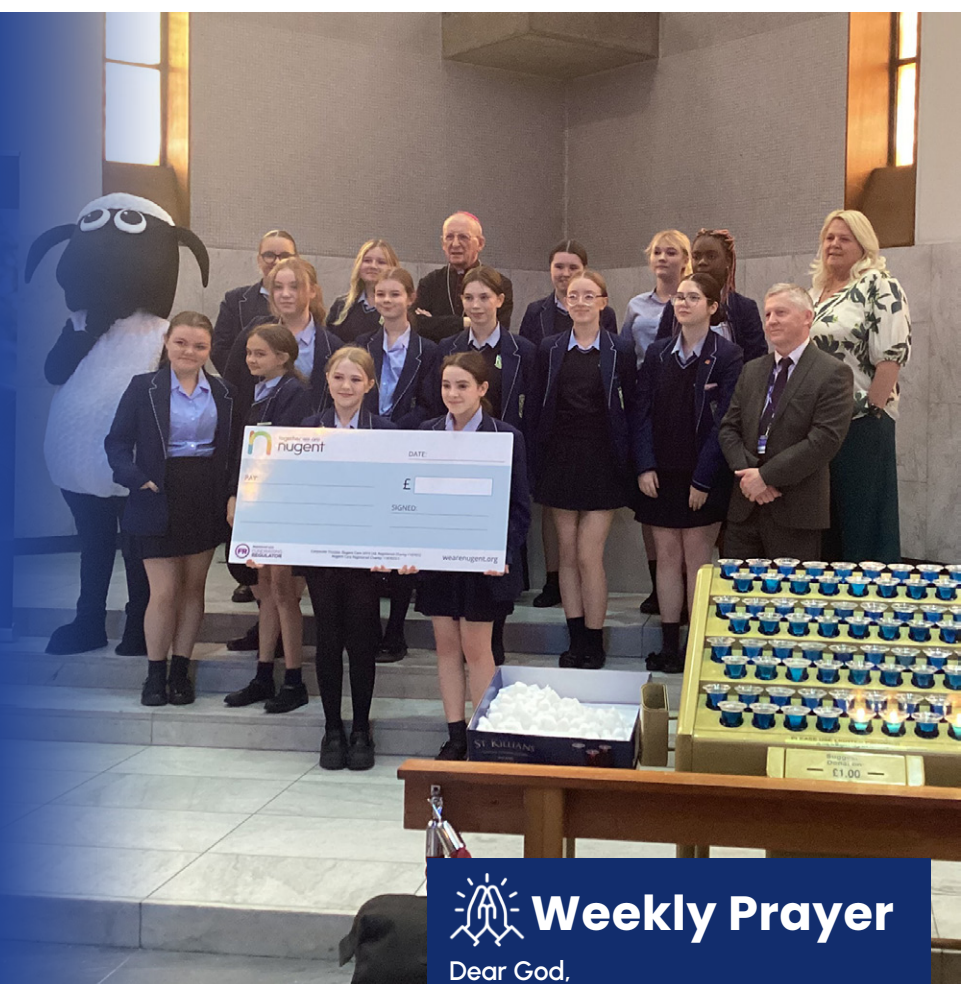

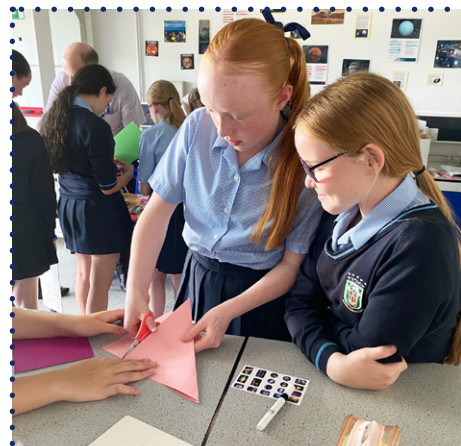
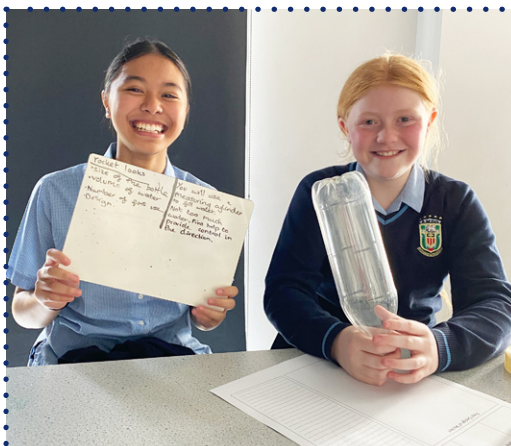

Our Generation Our Vote

On Friday 21st June, students across Year 7-12 took part in a nationwide political literacy programme where they were able to cast their votes in a ballot box for who they would like to elect to the government for the Liverpool West Derby Ward. Broughton Hall was among 112 schools and youth groups that submitted voting data as part of Our Generation Our Vote. Of the 112 schools, 17 of these were in the North West.

Students were introduced to the programme during form time and in assemblies and they were encouraged to voice their opinions on what concerns them the most. Students commented that education, climate change, cost of living crisis, and the NHS.



Their votes were sent to Our Generation Our Vote who counted up all the votes and were published Friday morning and was shared during Sky News Breakfast.

Broughton Hall's results for the Liverpool West Derby Ward was the following:

Labour Party 70%

Green Party 15%

Reform 5%

Liberal Democrats 3%

Liberal 2%

Conservative and Unionist Party 1%

Void 0.9%

Broughton Hall was very similar to the national vote of 22,889 6-17 year olds which voted the following way:

Labour 31.8%

Green Party 29.5%

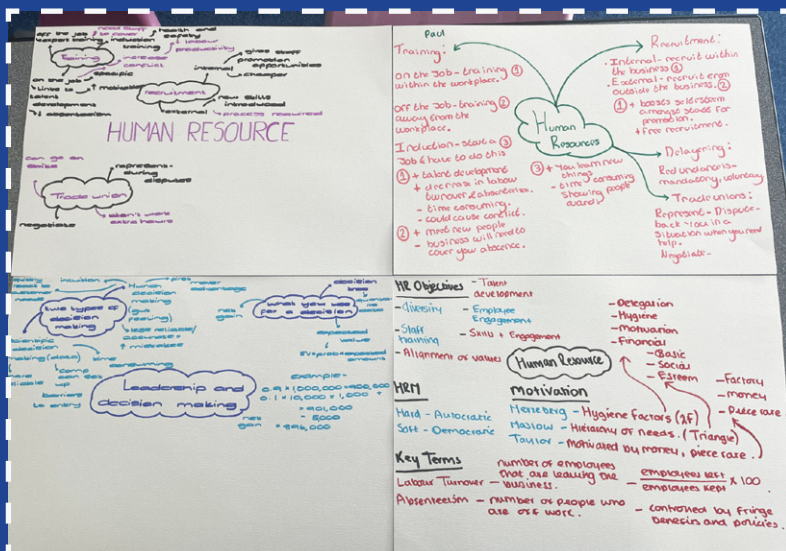
