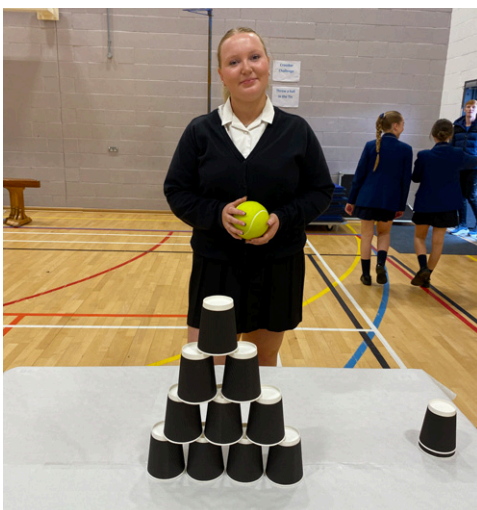
Entrepreneur Day

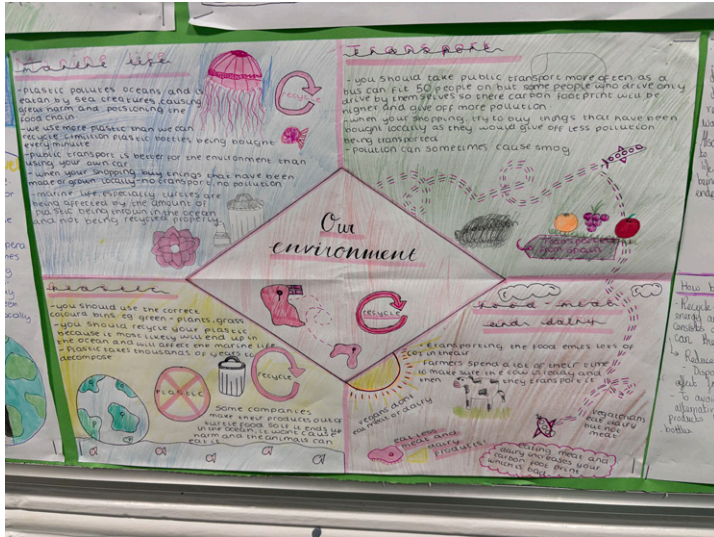
The girls used problem solving skills, organisational skills and communicated with each other really effectively. The girls were a little shy of the camera today, but we thought we'd share examples of their work instead!

Religious Education

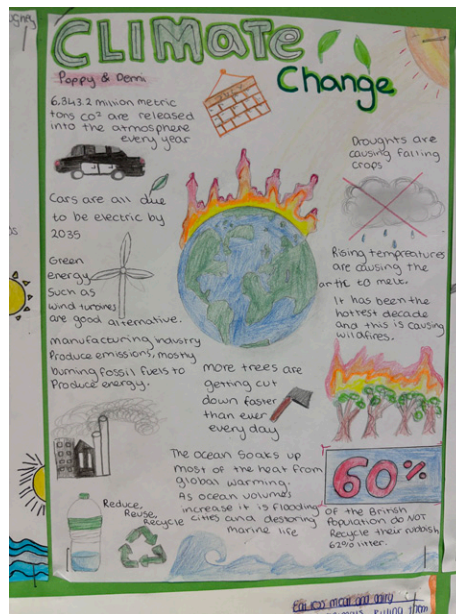
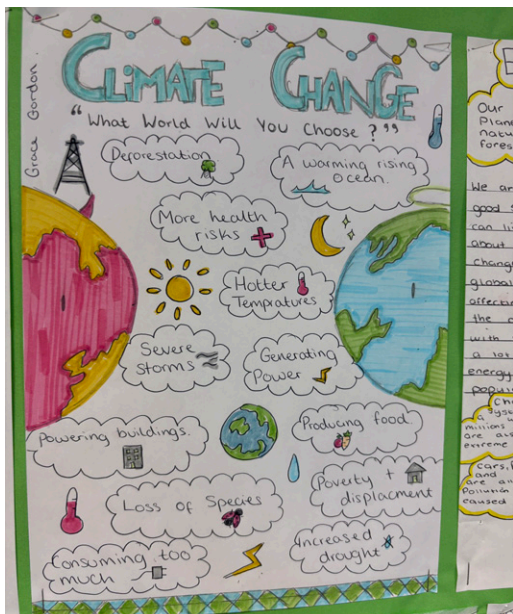
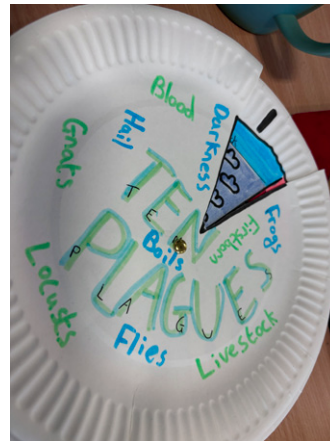
Year 9 students have been looking at environmental issues in RE and what the main issues are that we are facing in world today. Students have explored the way in which Religions respond to climate change and how their organisations work to help stop climate change.



Students have worked over the last few weeks and have been able to produce fantastic information posters that explain the main issues and ways in which we can work together to combat climate change. Some very informative work produced that has inspired and taught some of our younger students! Well done girls!

Students in year 7 have finished off their final unit in RE be looking closely at the 10 plagues. Over the weeks year 7 have explored what the 10 plagues are, why they happened, who was effected and if they think they should have happened.

The girls have enjoyed reading the Bible stories and being able to apply them to their learning. To showcase their understanding of 10 plagues, year 7 have been creating information wheels that show each of the plagues and describe what happened during each one. The girls have added pictures and information for each of the plagues. Fantastic work produced by all, well done girls!





Bronze Qualifying Expedition around Rivington Reservoir

Last week (4th–5th July) the current cohort of Bronze Award pupils completed their Bronze Qualifying Expedition around Rivington Reservoir. Although some think that D of E is just about walking and camping, this expedition forms just one quarter of their Award. Pupils also have to complete three other sections in their own time; Skills, Physical and Volunteering.

At the Bronze Level, two of these activities must take place of three months and one over six. All four parts of the Award must be complete in order to achieve this additional qualification.

Bronze expeditions take place over two days (Silver are three) with an overnight camp. As this expedition is assessed, there are a number of criteria this must fulfil and one of them is being self-sufficient. Pupils need to carry all of their camping equipment, food and clothing. Good teamwork skills are essential as well as navigating using an O.S. map and compass to ensure that they don't have to walk any further than they have to. If pupils go off the planned route they are expected to retrace their steps until they know they are back on the correct course.

Over the two days, the groups were great. Despite the odd groan and moan on day one about the weight of the rucksacks, they all still managed to make it back on time to the campsite. One group on Friday showed great teamwork and being self-sufficient. They had a carrier bag of rubbish when leaving the campsite. Knowing they had to be self-sufficient, they took turns to carry it on the second day of walking until they reached the finish.



The weather forecast had predicted it to be cool with sunny spells. I have not often felt the need to put my gloves on during an expedition in July! Showers were forecast on Thursday as we were walking but it turned out just to be short spells of drizzle. We all managed to sort out the tents in the dry and were spared any more rain on the Friday.

Thanks must go to Mr Hesketh, Miss Taylor, Mr Killilea and Mrs Grant for giving up their time to help staff this event and support our girls with this part of their Duke of Edinburgh Award. Mrs Grant drove up in the evening after work, camped overnight to help provide adequate female staff and then went back to school in the morning. Thank you also to all of the other 'behind the scenes staff' in school who helped make this expedition possible which include the office staff, cover, finance site services and reprographics.

All Bronze Award candidates must now ensure all four sections of their Award are complete. They will be aware that a fully complete and correct assessor card will need to be uploaded to their e-D of E account for all four parts of their Award. I look forward to giving out the certificates and badges early next term to those who have achieved their Bronze Award and hope many will want to progress onto the Silver Award in Year 10.
