







Year 7 Activities Week

LE has been helping to set the frame for a conservatory.




PS has been in Max Spielman and has been learning how to make personalised gifts, take passports photos and portraits and was able to serve customers.




JD and HW have been at the Manufacturing technology centre where they are making Stem projects to motivate students to go into the industry and they presenting this information to the employees of the company.




LW is at ARW Property Solutions and is learning how to operate the systems in the office, how they use applications to manage each property and the tenants. She's also learning about tenancies and tax also.
