Mr. Halewood, Miss Lawrence and Mr. Killilea led a group of twelve motivated students to the Ribble Valley, in a practice for next week's silver award challenge.

We asked some of the students to sum up what they enjoyed about the expedition, so in their own words: "We liked the sheep and a little rabbit who we named Geraldine". "It was a good technology detox, we re-connected with nature and had some great laughs with good friends". "Although it was hard going there was a great sense of achievement and satisfaction at the end".

Silver Award 2023-2024

Last week (19th – 21st September) sixteen Year 11 pupil completed their practice expedition as part of their Silver Duke of Edinburgh Award.



Unlike Bronze, at Silver participants are required to complete both a practice and assessed, qualifying expedition. The challenge increases with this next level of the Award as the expeditions involve participants to complete three days of their 'adventurous journey' and camp for two night. Pupils are expected to navigate using an O.S. map and compass, cook their own meals and be totally self-sufficient over the three days. Many pupils find the expedition a challenge and not just the physical aspect of carrying a rucksack, weighing up to a quarter of their body weight, on their back. Over the three days the pupils cover 35 kilometres of their pre-planned route in the Ribble Valley and every one of them showed improvement during the expedition.

The weather had forecast warm sunny days with cooler nights – an answer to prayer considering the time of year. We were relieved that we didn't wake to damp tents both mornings as it had clouded over in the evenings. The two campsites were perfect for us as we're not meant to be glamping! Hacking Hall campsite, right on the banks of the River Ribble, even opened up for us especially as they're a working farm and only have a pop-up campsite running in the summer.

Exhausted, the last groups arrived at the finish, on Saturday, in Ribchester, at 12:30 and shortly after the coach returned us to school. The pupils now have their qualifying expedition to prepare for next week (3rd-5th October) in West Lancashire.

The Year 11 pupils were fantastic overall and an absolute credit to themselves and the School. A huge thank you must go to Miss Lawrence and Mr Killilea for giving up part of their weekend to help staff this event and support our girls with this part of their Duke of Edinburgh Award. Thank you also to all of the other 'behind the scenes staff' who helped make this expedition possible.

Message from NHS Mersey Care

Your child's flu immunisation is due this term. It's important that all parents/carers read and respond to this message to avoid receiving further telephone calls, texts and letters from our service.

Please visit this link https://econsent.merseycare.nhs.uk/ and complete your child's flu form with a yes or no, parents are encouraged to complete the form before the end of September. Via this link, you can select the nasal spray for the best protection or the alternative injectable flu if required.



Any forms completed late may result in your child not receiving their flu immunisation at the first school session. Flu can be a really unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will help to protect them as well as more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu this year. Year 8 and 9 parents can also complete your child's secondary school immunisation forms via this link.


